This console has been recapped with Nichicons and works well. Most of the knobs are still intact and every control is operational. Each mic input channel has upgraded Jensen mic transformers, and on the motherboard all line transformers have been bypassed with jumpers. This console also had a custom XLR panel on the rear that provides all console inputs & outputs, machine sends & returns plus all tie lines. This allows you to bypass dealing with the pristene punch blocks which have only been used one time and one time only.

This console was primarily used with an MCI JH16/24 and the transformers were redundant in that application. returning it to factory spec would be very simple.

Having the transformers might be advantageous with any number of DAW systems. I do have 20 BOVA class "A" retrofittable amps that can simply plug into the same octal socket used by the 2001 opamps. The new BOVA amps have about 4X the slew rate of the 2001 and that really does make the drums a whole lot punchier.
